The Accountancy curriculum is designed to provide students with the necessary requirements to sit for the Certified Management Accountant (CMA) examination. The curriculum is also designed to fulfill the requirements to sit for the Certified Public Accountant (CPA) examination for students completing the requisite 150 hours through the MBA program.

C-SC's accountancy program gives students the skills employers want. Employers are looking for graduates with strong interpersonal skills, and the accountancy curriculum helps students develop
